A regular meeting of the City Council of Gering, Nebraska was held in open session on November 14, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. at Gering City Hall, 1025 P Street, Gering, NE. CURRENT BUSINESS:

1. Update/comments regarding the Gering Police Department partnership with the Gering Public Schools – Superintendent Hastings

Superintendent Hastings stated that he wanted to give an update to the Mayor and Council about what the Schools and Police Department have worked on together for the last couple of years. The SRO program was put into motion about three and a half years ago; Chief Holthus did most of the leg work on the grant. They were able to bring in Officer Moreno and now Officer West. It has been a very positive program for their staff and students. The officers do a great job in the schools and provide a sense of security. They provide a perspective that staff don't have and that's a good thing. He appreciates what they do and that the City is willing to make that kind of investment in the school system. Secondly they've worked closely with the Gering Police Department to step up safety measures in the schools. Last summer they redid all their safety plans. He said that Chief Holthus has been an invaluable asset in that process; he is more than willing to come in and help them and share his ideas and thoughts. He wants Council to know there are a lot of people within the City who are doing things right and George, Jason and the School Resource Officers are good examples. He also thanked Administrator Danielzuk for all he has done to bring this together and make it happen smoothly. Councilmember Christensen stated that he thinks this is one of the best programs the City has ever been involved with and he hopes it continues. Councilmember Morrison commended Administrator Danielzuk, Superintendent Hastings and Chief Holthus. Chief Holthus added that any cooperative effort involves more than one agency. He thanked the Mayor, Council and Administrator Danielzuk for their support and guidance as well. Mayor Kaufman added that he appreciates Superintendent Hasting's feedback, update and partnership as well.

2. Request for Administrative Committee meeting – Agenda items: Consideration of Cost of Living increase for Mayor and Council, Update to Procurement Policies/Procedures
