Pastor Scott Mathis, "The Cowboy Preacher" was raised on the Wyoming frontier. Growing up training horses with his father and older brother he has spent much of his life on horseback. The son of a country preacher, Scott rejected his godly parent's teachings and left home at 14, going the "way of the world". Majoring in History at the University of

Wyoming in a vain attempt to disprove Christianity, Scott ridiculed Christians and attempted to talk them out of their faith. Meanwhile, his parents were faithfully praying.

Diane played volleyball for the University of Wyoming and accepted Christ as her Savior her freshman year in college through the godly influence of her teammates, but experienced very little growth as a new believer. When Scott & Diane were married, they both brought baggage into the marriage, but the Lord began to work in their hearts and in 1990, Diane rededicated her life to Jesus and Scott was gloriously saved!

In 1992, Scott & Diane left a ranch in northern Nebraska, to respond to God's call on their life into pastoral ministry at Mitchell Berean Church in Mitchell, Nebraska where they served for 19 years. In 2011, they followed God's call to help plant SONrise Church in Torrington, Wyoming, and in 2016 Scott was asked to become the President of the Berean Fellowship of Churches.

Scott & Diane celebrated 36 years of marriage in March. They have two children and four grandchildren. Every day they marvel at how God has saved them, changed them, and allowed them the privilege of serving HIM in full-time ministry.
