AMENDMENTS TO THE **EMERGENCY SNOW REMOVAL ORDINANCE**

recently passed an ordinance amending the Emergency Snow Removal Ordinance. The amended ordinance adds Secondary Snow Routes, shown right. The purpose of Secondary Snow Routes is twofold. First, most of these routes are located around schools.

designating them as Secondary Snow Routes, City crews can clear snow more efficiently quickly in these areas, improving traffic safety

around schools. Additionally, the equipment used by the City's Street Department for snow removal is too wide to maneuver easily on side streets. Parked vehicles have been damaged when vehicles are parked on both sides of the street.

Provisions in the ordinance require that residents living on designated Secondary Routes must park on the odd or even numbered side of the street when a Snow Emergency is declared and until it is lifted. This will allow enough room for City crews and equipment to windrow snow and remove it prior to school resuming. When a Snow Emergency is declared, parking where normally allowed on both sides of a

The Gering City Council street, will be limited to either the odd or even numbered side of the street on all Secondary Emergency Snow Routes. Citations may be issued to citizens who have vehicles or other property parked on the wrong side of the street.

> The penalty for not removing parked vehicles or

> > other property from Primary and Secondary Snow routes during a Snow Emergency has been increased to \$250. Vehicles will be towed at the

owner's expense.



PLEASE NOTE!

During this coming snow season, when snow emergencies are declared, citations will not be issued to anyone on SECONDARY **Emergency Snow Routes.** During the first year of this amended ordinance, the City will focus on public education to help residents become familiar with the process. However, anyone who leaves vehicles or other property parked on a **Primary Snow Route** will be issued a citation if the vehicle is not removed after a Snow Emergency has been declared.

HOW TO KNOW WHEN A SNOW **EMERGENCY HAS BEEN DECLARED**

The best way to know if a Snow Emergency has been declared is by checking local media outlets, the City's website and the City's Facebook page. If a storm is coming, or if snow is accumulating, there is always a chance that a Snow Emergency could be declared. When a Snow Emergency is declared (or even if you think one might be) plan to move vehicles, trailers, campers, etc., off of Primary Snow Routes and off of the odd or even numbered side of streets on Secondary Snow Routes as shown above. WINTER PET CARE

FEED AND WATER WELL Give your pet plenty of food and fresh water; keeping warm outdoors takes energy. CHECK PAWS - Wipe

paws with a damp towel to remove salt. Also, remove snow from between toes to prevent frostbite.

SHELTER - If your pet must be outside, provide a draft-free shelter large enough to stand and turn around in, yet small enough to retain heat. Use a layer of straw or bedding material for insulation. Bring pets inside during extreme cold spells.

> Never leave your pet in a vehicle during cold weather.

SAFETY - Certain antifreeze is deadly, but tastes sweet. Wipe spills or drips to protect children and animals. Keep pets away from lit candles and Poinset-

Holiday Fire Safety

- Choose flame resistant or flame retardant decorations.
- Keep lit candles away from anything that can burn and out of reach of children and animals.
- Do not overuse extension cords or power strips.
- Discard damaged extension cords, power strips and light strands.
- Stay in the kitchen when cooking

on the stovetop.

- Water live Christmas trees daily.
- Inspect light strands for damage.
- Make sure trees are at least three feet away from any heat source like fire places, radiators, candles, heat vents, or lights.

- Always turn off tree lights before leaving or going to bed.
