When does the Gering City Council meet?



Regular meetings, by ordinance, are scheduled on the second and fourth Monday of each month at 6 p.m. unless they fall on a holiday or if Council votes to cancel the meeting or change the date. The Council may also schedule special or emergency meetings when deemed necessary. Meetings

are held at Gering City Hall, 1025 P

Street, Gering, NE.

When does Council review/discuss the proposed fiscal year budget?

Council attends a Budget Work Session that is open to the public in July or August of each year. The date and time of the work session is published in the public notice section of the Star-Herald. It is also posted on the City's website: www.gering.org. In addition, the City will publish the date and time of the Budget Work Session in the City's newsletter and on the City's Facebook page. Residential customers will also see it on their utility bill.

When can I address the City Council?

The public may address the Mayor and Council during the Open Comment Period of a regular City Council meeting. Open Comment Periods are held during the second regular meeting of the month. However, because it's considered unscheduled business, Council cannot take action or discuss the matter. Citizens may also complete a "Request for Future Agenda Item" form. Staff will review the completed form and determine if the matter should be placed on a City Council agenda or if it can be addressed by City staff.

Public Hearings

For certain items Council must, by statute, conduct a public hearing. Anyone is welcome to attend public hearings to state support or opposition to various matters such as the an-



nual budget, zoning changes, TIF, liquor license applications and other matters that require a public hearing.

Interested in running for City Council?

If you are interested in running for Gering City Council, you may pay the filing fee (\$36.50) at the City of Gering Administrative Of-



fices (1025 P Street) after which you will take your receipt to the Scotts Bluff County Election Office to file for office. City offices are open from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday - Friday. The deadline for new filings is March 1, 2024 at 5:00 p.m. (at the Election Office). Call (308) 436-6812 if you have questions.
